The Prisoner of War Committee of Michigan is a nonprofit organization incorporated on July 17, 1973 by POW/MIA family members.

The objectives of the Committee remain the same today as they were in 1973: the release of all US prisoners of war; the fullest possible accounting for those still missing; and the repatriation of all recoverable remains.



The Committee supports postive public awareness for the POW/MIA issue through distribution of factual information; sales of POW/MIA logo items; a speakers' group for POW/MIA presentations; managing the annual POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremony at the "Michigan Remembers" POW/MIA Memorial located at Oakland Hills Memorial Gardens in Novi, Michigan; and participation in public events such as parades, air shows, and patriotic ceremonies.

The Committee works in partnership with the National League of POW/MIA Families and veterans' organization to achieve our shared objectives.

"MICHIGAN REMEMBERS" POW/MIA MEMORIAL

The "Michigan Remembers" POW-MIA Memorial is a beautiful bronze and black granite tribute honoring 84 Michigan POW-MIAs from the Vietnam War — 35 with remains returned and 49 who remain unaccounted for in Southeast Asia.

Since the unveiling and dedication on September 19, 1986, the "Michigan Remembers" POW-MIA Memorial has become a focal point for National POW-MIA Recognition Day activities in Michigan, and is visited year-round by POW-MIA family members, veterans and others who come to honor the men represented there as well as all who remain unaccounted for from our nation's wars.

Several enhancements were made to the site after the 1986 dedication. An eternal flame (maintained by the Prisoner of War Committee of Michigan), a stairway (made possible by VVA Chapter 154) and a flagpole (donated by Ford Motor Company) were added prior to 1990. Since then, a small granite Vietnam Memorial, a WW II Memorial, a marker honoring Michigan MIAs from the war in Iraq, and a wall mural have been incorporated into this place of honor.
