Livingston Rednecks, Clemente League vs. Thornhill Thunder, Roberto League

Game One - at Thornhill

After each team had squeaked by in their seven-game drama-packed League Championship Series, the Livingston Rednecks sent ace Curt Schilling out to face surprise starter John Smoltz of the Thornhill Thunder in the opener of the 1999-2000 ABC equivalent of the World Series.

It didn't take long for a dramatic turn of events to occur. Smoltz downed the visitors in the first, allowing only a single to Moises Alou. Schilling took the hill and retired Craig Biggio on a liner to Ventura at third. As DH Jeff Kent stepped in the batter's box, Schilling walked off the mound holding his wrist. Buck Miller II had no choice; he had to call in Rickey Bones to replace his ailing starter. Schilling was pronounced out for five days, meaning he would also miss his second scheduled start of the series.

Bones did the job. He allowed a single to Kent, the first batter he faced, and then proceeded to shut down the Thunder for the next 4 2/3 innings, fanning 5 and walking only 1. Smoltz was no less impressive. At the end of five, it was still a scoreless tie. Thornhill had three safeties, Livingston only Alou's single.

In the top of the sixth, the first of 3 Thornhill errors cost Smoltz as the Rednecks took a 1-0 lead on a two out single by Mark Grace, and after Sosa bobbled the ball in right field allowing Grace an extra 90 feet, an RBI double by the ageless Tony Gwynn.

Turk Wendell replaced Bones for the Thornhill sixth. Dodging a single by Jeff Kent, he put down the Thunder to hold the lead. In the Livingston seventh, Lofton singled with two out and Glenallen Hill's throw sailed wildly, allowing the speedy Lofton to reach second with Edgar Martinez coming up. Smoltz got Martinez on a liner to Hill in left to escape without further damage.

John Olerud opened the home half with a double after the fans took their seventh inning stretch. With

two outs, he was still at second when Terry Steinbach grounded a single past Deivi Cruz at short. Olerud challenged Moises Alou's arm and just beat the throw to the plate to tie the game at 1-1. Disarcina fanned to end the rally.

In the Redneck eighth, Mark Grace drew a one out walk, the third allowed by Smoltz. Gwynn, who had doubled in the lone Livingston run back in the sixth, drilled a double to right. Sosa's strong throw caused Grace to stop at third. Rogin Ventura bailed out on a Smoltz high fastball and dribbled a roller to Olerud at first base. Olerud flipped to Smoltz for the second out of the inning, but Grace scored from third and Gwynn moved up from second. Buck Miller decided to go for the big inning and sent Mike Simms up to pinch hit for Chris Stynes. Simms smoked a liner headed toward right field, but Biggio leapt and snagged it in the webbing of his glove to snuff out the rally.

Now pitching with a 2-1 lead, Wendell fanned Biggio and Kent in the Thunder eighth; and got Sosa on a line drive to Grace for the third out.

Jason Christiansen relieved Smoltz in the ninth and retired the Rednecks in order to set the stage for the bottom of the ninth. Thornhill appeared to be in good shape with Vinny Castilla, Olerud, and Glenallen Hill due up. Miller elected to leave Wendell in, despite the fact that he had already pitched three innings – his longest outing of the season.

Wendell got Castilla on a tough play grounder to Deivi Cruz and struck out John Olerud. Hill smashed a ground ball wide of third, but Ventura got to it and nipped him at first to end the game.

Game Two - at Thornhill

Livingston sent righthander Rolando Arrojo out to face Thornhill righty Rick Helling in game two. After the pitching duel of game one, it was inevitable that the bats would explode in game two.

Arrojo and Helling swapped zeroes in the first, but the Thunder rolled in the home second. Vinny Castilla ended the scoring drought quickly with a lead-off home run over the left field wall. Two outs later, John Olerud lined a single back through the box and Terry Steinbach hit a laser over Stynes head for back-to-back singles. DiSarcina drove in Olerud and sent Steinbach to third with a single to right for a 2-0 Thornhill lead. Craig Biggio followed with the fifth hit of the inning, an RBI single for a 3-0 Thornhill margin.

Helling worked out of a jam in the top of the fourth and Sammy Sosa cracked his first homer of the series in the bottom half to stretch the Thunder lead to 4-0.

It stayed that way until the Livingston seventh. Buck Miller got a pinch hit single by Jesse Levis, who batted for Nilsson. Then pinch hitter Roberto Kelly, batting for Chris Stynes, tagged Helling for an opposite field two-run homer to put the Rednecks on the scoreboard. With Martinez and Grace coming up, manager Marc Siegel had seen enough of Helling. He called on Paul Quantrill. Quantrill got Martinez, but walked Grace. He then retired Kenny Lofton on an infield bouncer to snuff out the Redneck rally.

With the lead cut to two runs, DiSarcina opened the Thunder seventh by lacing a single off Arrojo. Rolando then issued his second walk, this one to Craig Biggio to put Thunder runners on first and second.

Buck Miller II brought in Tim Crabtree to face Jeff Kent. Crabtree struck out Kent, but then served up a 3-run gopher ball to Sosa. It was Sammy's second homer of the game and broke it open to a 7-2 Thornhill lead.

Obviously unnerved, Crabtree surrendered a double to Vinny Castilla and walks to Olerud and Glenallen Hill to load the bases. With the infield looking for a double play, Crabtree hung a slider to Paul O'Neill who deposited it in the right field pavilion for a grand slam and an 11-2 margin.

It looked like the rout was on, but the Rednecks weren't quite dead. The boys from the bayou state battered Jeff Tabaka, Tom Gordon and Aaron Sele for six runs in the ninth before finally giving up the ghost as Thornhill hung on for an 11-8 victory to even the series.

The Redneck explosion featured a consecutive batter cycle as Grace singled, Alou tripled, Gwynn doubled and Robin Ventura cracked a 2-run homer to cut the gap to the final Thornhill margin of victory. Helling got the win with his 6 1/3 innings of work and Arrojo took the loss.

With the series tied a one game apiece, it now moves to Denham Springs for games 3, 4 and 5.

Game Three - at Livingston

Championship fever swept Denham Springs and the surrounding hamlets of Livingston Parish as the Thornhill Thunder invaded the Redneck Roost for game three of the ABC championship series. “Eat More Canadian Bacon” bumper stickers covered the hundreds of pickup trucks and RV’s that ringed the drive-in outfield parking area. The overflow crowds were treated to free Canadian Bacon pizzas and Dixie beer by the generous team ownership. It was a festive atmosphere to say the least as Livingston’s Boomer Wells belched his way to the mound to oppose Thornhill southpaw Al Leiter.

Apparently Sammy Sosa didn’t appreciate the “Put the Whammy on Sammy” banner in left field. He walloped a David Wells hanging curve ball about 50 feet past it in left field in his first at bat to put the visitors ahead 1-0 in the first inning. It was Sosa’s third dinger of the series.

Leiter got off to a spectacular start. He retired the Rednecks in order in the first and struck out the side in the second. He got Jason Varitek for his fourth consecutive K to open the third and didn’t allow a hit until Edgar Martinez broke his 0 for the series slump with a hit-and-run single with two outs in the third, following a walk to Kenny Lofton. Robin Ventura flied out deep to Sosa in right, as Leiter continued to frustrate the Rednecks.

Meanwhile, after shaking off Sosa’s first inning homer, Boomer got untracked. With the help of two double plays and a caught stealing on Jeff Kent, he blanked the men from Canada over the next seven innings.

Moises Alou got the second hit off Leiter leading off the Livingston fourth. It was a towering home run over the left center field fence and into the RV section, tying the score at 1-1.

Leiter lost his control and his location in the Redneck sixth. He walked Robin Ventura to open the inning, and hung a slider to Alou for a double, sending Ventura to third. That brought Roberto Kelly to the plate. Kelly stroked a low liner to center, and when Paul O’Neill failed to make a diving catch, both

Ventura and Alou scored to give the Rednecks a 3-1 lead. Kelly was credited with a single and 2 RBIs. Mark Grace then reached on a throwing error by third baseman Vinny Castilla. Leiter recovered his composure, however, and got pinch hitter Mike Simms on a pop-up and induced Jason Varitek to ground into an inning-ending double play.

With two down in the home seventh, Leiter issued his fifth and sixth walks — to Edgar Martinez and Robin Ventura. Manager Red Martin called on Dennis Cook to face Moises Alou. Redneck manager Warren Wool replaced Martinez at second with the speedy Rich Amaral, but Alou grounded into a force play at second to end the inning with the score still Livingston 3-1.

Both teams went quietly in the eighth, but not so in the ninth. Wells got Craig Biggio on a routine fly for the first out of the Thornhill ninth. By this time the crowd was on its feet (those who could still stand, that is). Jeff Kent then reached on a checked swing blooper to center and Sosa dug in to face Wells for one last time. Sammy got all of a Boomer fastball and tied the game with a deep drive over the center field fence.

As Sosa circled the bases, clapping his hands, you could actually hear him clapping, the silence was so tomb-like. Vinny Castilla followed with a liner that got by Lofton for a double and the tension mounted. After a conference with manager Wool, Wells intentionally passed Olerud to set up a double play possibility with lefty Paul O’Neill coming up.

Wells missed with ball one to O’Neill; then got him to chase a low curveball. O’Neill grooved it right to Chris Stynes at second, who flipped to Deivi Cruz and then on to Grace for the inning-ending double play. You could hear the Whoosh from the crowd.

The Rednecks had the lower part of the batting order due in the bottom of the ninth, so it looked like a sure bet for extra innings. But Cook walked lead-off man Jason Varitek to put the potential winning run aboard. Chris Stynes then attempted to bunt Varitek to second, but fouled off two attempts. Wool took off the bunt sign with two strikes and Stynes responded with a single to left to put runners on first and second with no outs and Kenny Lofton coming to the plate.

Wool then sent in Eric Young to run for Varitek at second and ordered Lofton to sacrifice. Cook couldn't find the plate, however, and walked Lofton on four pitches. That loaded the bases for Rich Amaral who earlier had pinch run for Edgar Martinez.

Red Martin pulled his infield in suspecting a possible squeeze play and he pulled his outfield in half way. Amaral hit a medium-deep fly to straightaway center that O'Neill caught on the run and Eric Young outran O'Neill's desperate throw to the plate for the winning run. Final score Rednecks 4, Thornhill 3.

Wells went the distance for the victory, allowing 8 hits, striking out 3, and only walking 1 --- the intentional walk to Olerud in the ninth. Dennis Cook took the loss. Leiter and Cook combined to allow only 5 hits to the Rednecks, but they issued 8 bases on balls.

Game Four - at Livingston

Thornhill southpaw Randy Johnson carried the torch for the visitors in game four against righthander Bret Saberhagen.

The Thunder struck in typical fashion in the top of the second. Vinny Castilla and Paul O'Neill launched solo homers to put Johnson ahead 2-0. Through the first two innings, the Big Unit fanned four of the six batters he faced.

Eric Young got the first Livingston hit off Johnson leading off the home third. Young ripped a double off the wall in right center. Figuring that the game would be low-scoring at best, Rednecks manager Wool ordered Jason Varitek to bunt. Varitek bunted the ball right back to the mound. Johnson looked at third and then threw a high hard one into right field. Young scored, making it a 2-1 ballgame and Varitek wound up on second.

Deivi Cruz then tried his hand at bunting but popped out to Castilla for the first out of the inning. Kenny Lofton followed Cruz' abortive sacrifice with a triple to right. Varitek scored to tie the game at 2-2. Johnson fanned Edgar Martinez for his fifth K, but Robin Ventura picked up Martinez by laced an opposite field single to left, scoring Lofton. Ventura wound up at second as Jose Canseco bobbled the ball for the second Thornhill error of the inning. Moises Alou grounded out, but the Rednecks had gained a 3-2 lead.

Saberhagen departed after five innings, having allowed only the two solo home runs, four hits, one strikeout, but no walks. Jim Bruske made his first series appearance and got the Thunder in the sixth.

The Rednecks increased the lead to 4-2 in their half of the sixth in classic Livingston fashion. Grace drew a lead-off walk and moved to second on a hit and run bounce out by Eric Young. Jason Varitek drove Grace home with a single to left. Grace easily outran Canseco's rainbow throw and Varitek took second on it. Johnson fanned the next two Rednecks to limit the

damage to one run.

In the Thornhill seventh, Doug Brocail relieved Bruske after a one out single by Canseco. Brocail whiffed Fasano and got DiSarcina on an infield bouncer to kill the rally.

The Thunder finally scored again in the 8th off Brocail. A walk to Biggio, an infield out, and a single by Vinny Castilla — his third hit of the game — cut the Redneck lead to 4-3.

Brocail struck out the first two Thunder batters in the ninth, and then walked pinch hitter Shane Spencer. Wool called on Turk Wendell to face Gary DiSarcina after Red Martin sent Damon Buford in to run for Spencer at first base. DiSarcina topped a room-service bouncer back to the mound, but Wendell fumbled it for an error. That put the tying run at second and the potential lead runner on at first and brought gritty Craig Biggio to the plate.

Biggio worked Wendell for a walk to load the bases as the crowd buzzed. Wool went out to visit the Turk, and after the umpires broke up the confab, left him in to face Jeff Kent. Kent bounced one to Deivi Cruz at short who tossed to Young for the force on Biggio to preserve the second consecutive 4-3 Redneck victory.

Game Five - at Livingston

The sound system at the Redneck Roost blared out Jerry Jeff Walker's immortal *Up Against the Wall, Redneck Mother!*, miniature red-handled brooms were distributed to the throngs in attendance, and the *Eat More Canadian Bacon* banners and bumper stickers were back in force as Jose "Lima Time" took the mound to face the Thornhill Thunder in game five of the ABC Championship Series.

Lima started in place of Livingston Ace Curt Schilling who had to leave game one after only 1/3 of an inning with a wrist injury. Lima's opponent was Thunder righthander John Smoltz, the tough-luck 2-1 loser in game one.

It looked as though the Thunder wanted to erase any doubts about their ability to come back as Craig Biggio lined Lima's first offering for a base hit to left center. Lima bowed his back and fanned Jeff Kent and then Sammy Sosa as Biggio stole second. He brought the crowd to its feet in a "thunderous" ovation as he whiffed Vinny Castilla to end the first.

The crowd was still standing as Kenny Lofton coaxed a four-pitch walk off Smoltz to open the Redneck first. Manager Warren Wool set the wheels in motion immediately, fulfilling his promise to the fans. Wool said at the post-game press conference after the Rednecks' 4-3 game four victory, "We're gonna bring the fight to 'em. We're gonna be patient at the plate, make 'em throw strikes, and run like hell when our bat control guys are at the plate."

Lofton took off on the first pitch to Edgar Martinez. Red Martin called for a pitchout and Edgar lunged at the outside fastball and got just enough of it to bleed it through the right side. Lofton scampered to third and the race was on. Moises Alou then lunged for another Smoltz offering and blooped it over shortstop Gary DiSarcina's head, scoring Lofton and advancing Martinez to second. That brought up Mark Grace, still with nobody out. Grace leaned into a Smoltz fastball and deposited it in the right field pickup truck section for his first homer of the series and a 4-0 Redneck lead — with no outs in the first!

Tony Gwynn almost made it back-to-back jacks,

but Paul O'Neill flagged down his bid on the warning track. Robin Ventura struck out, then Eric Young got a broken-bat single over second. David Nilsson then tied into another Smoltz heater as Young broke for second and ran Sammy Sosa into the right field fence. Sosa hung on to the ball and the first inning ended 4-0 Livingston.

If anyone thought that Thornhill would throw in the towel, the Thunder quickly changed their minds in the top of the second. Olerud drilled a Lima change-up for a lead-off double. He disposed of O'Neill and Canseco without any advance by Olerud; and got Sal Fasano to hit a towering fly ball to medium deep right field to Tony Gwynn. But, Gwynn dropped the ball and Olerud beat his throw to the plate.

Gwynn's error opened the floodgates. DiSarcina followed with his first homer of the series. The two run shot made the score 4-3. Craig Biggio then launched a monster shot to tie the game at 4-4. Lima got Kent to end the nightmare, but the Redneck four-run lead was gone. All the runs were unearned, but the Thunder had proven that they would not go down without a fight.

With his new lease on life, Smoltz fanned Cruz to open the Livingston second. Lofton beat out a squibber to third for an infield single; and, once again, Martinez lunged at a pitchout with Lofton racing toward second and bled it through the right side for a hit-and-run single, sending Lofton to third.

Smoltz got Moises Alou on strikes, but not before he uncorked a wild pitch to score Lofton and move Martinez to second. Mark Grace singled Martinez home for a 6-4 Livingston lead. Sammy Sosa's throw to the plate was cut off and Thornhill nailed Grace going for second to end the inning.

Neither team scored in the third. Lima fanned two to up his total to five K's in three innings. Red Martin pulled Smoltz after he gave up a two out single to Eric Young. Lefty Dennis Cook came on and fanned David Nilsson to end the threat. Smoltz's line for the game was unimpressive — 2 2/3 innings, 8 hits, 6 runs, 4 strikeouts, and 1 walk.

Lima lost his second lead of the game in the

Thornhill fourth. Jose Canseco and Sal Fasano hit back-to-back dingers to tie the score at 6-6. That made it twice for back-to-back jacks and a total of four homers off Lima. DiSarcina followed Fasano's homer with a single to left, and Wool came out to get Jose. Rickey Bones relieved and retired the side without further damage.

Lima's line was almost as bad as Smoltz's — 3 innings, 8 hits, 6 runs, 2 earned runs, 5 K's, and no walks.

Kenny Lofton reached for the third consecutive at bat as he laced a lead-off double in the Redneck half of the fourth. Cook then walked Martinez to quickly get himself into another jam. Moises Alou took care of the base runner traffic. He launched his second home run of the series into the RV section and put the Rednecks back on-top 9-6. Cook managed to finish the inning without further damage, in spite of yet another walk — this one to Tony Gwynn.

With a home team 9-6 lead and Lima out of the game, the crowd was celebrating again as the Thunder came up in the fifth to face Bones. Sammy Sosa quieted them instantly as he led-off with his fifth homer of the series and the fifth Thornhill blast of the game. Bones then lost *his* control. He walked Castilla and Olerud back-to-back. Paul O'Neill almost reached the seats, but his deep drive to right only moved Castilla to third after Gwynn made the catch. Jose Canseco narrowed the gap to 9-8 with an RBI single to left. Bones settled down and got out of the inning without further damage.

Cook got the Rednecks in the fifth, allowing only a single to Deivi Cruz. With the top of the Thornhill order due up in the sixth, Wool pulled Bones in favor of Tim Crabtree. The move paid off, as Crabtree set down the Thunder trio with the help of another double play.

Red Martin replaced Cook with Paul Quantrill for the Livingston sixth. It would be decision he would live to regret. Edgar Martinez greeted Quantrill with a single and Moises Alou unloaded a 2-run dinger before the crowd had settled back in their seats. Alou's homer made the score 11-8. Quantrill then walked Mark Grace and Tony Gwynn followed with another hit-and-run single, sending Grace to third. A walk to Robin Ventura loaded the bases, and Eric Young

plated Grace with a sacrifice fly to make it 12-8.

Red Martin brought on lefty Sean Runyan to face Nilsson and Runyan retired Nilsson on a fly out, but then he walked Deivi Cruz to re-load the bases. Lofton upped the ante to 14-8 with a two-run single, sending Nilsson all the way to third and taking second on the throw to the plate. Edgar Martinez then collected his fourth hit of the game, a two-run single. The two point conversion made the score 16-8 Livingston. Alou grounded out, but the damage was done. The 7 run outburst blew the game wide open.

The Rednecks continued the onslaught in the seventh, scoring another run on a walk to Grace, another hit-and-run single by Gwynn, and a sacrifice fly by Ventura.

Crabtree completely shut down the Thunder in his 3 inning stint. The Rednecks added two more runs in the bottom of the 8th. Another walk to Deivi Cruz finished off Runyan, and Red Martin brought in Jeff Tabaka. After a force-out, Lofton broke for second, and for the third time in the game, Edgar Martinez foiled a pitchout with a hit-and-run single. Moises Alou picked up his 7th RBI of the game with a single to score Lofton; and Mark Grace added another run on a ground out to make the score 19-8 — the final margin of victory for the Rednecks.

Turk Wendell closed it out for the Rednecks, surviving two hits and an error, but not allowing a score in the Thornhill ninth. The game ended 19-8 and the Rednecks earned the 1999 Arriba Baseball Confederation championship by sweeping Thornhill at home for a four games to one series victory.

Rickey Bones got credit for the win. Dennis Cook absorbed his second loss of the series. Edgar Martinez finished the game with a 5 for 5 mark, Moises Alou was 4-6 with 7 RBI. Kenny Lofton had 3 hits and scored 5 runs. In addition to the 19 hits, the Rednecks collected 8 walks from the Thornhill hurlers. John Olerud had 3 of the Thunder's 14 hits. There were a total of 8 home runs (5 by Thornhill).

The Rednecks outhit Thornhill .272 to .266; were out-homered by the Thunder 13 to 6; but drew 31 walks to only 13 by the Canadians; and outscored them 37 to 26.

Redneck hurlers posted a 4.50 ERA while Thornhill chuckers tallied a whopping 7.02 ERA. The Thunder committed 8 errors in the five games; Livingston had 3 blunders.

Vinny Castilla of Thornhill led all batters with a .429 mark; but Livingston's MVP Moises Alou tied Vinny for top honors with nine hits and drove in 10 runs as well. Half of Alou's safeties went for extra bases — a double, a triple, and three home runs. Moises slugged at a .955 pace, hit .409, and posted a .435 on-base

average.

Mark Grace tied Kenny Lofton for the most runs — each scored 7 times. Grace led all hitters with 8 bases on balls, hit .400 and had a .609 OBA.

Sammy Sosa cracked five homers and led Thornhill with 8 RBI. Sosa also collected a double as his only other hit.

The Rednecks had seven players hit .300 or better compared to only two for Thornhill.

Livingston turned five double plays; Thornhill only one.

No pitcher notched more than one victory, but Thornhill's Dennis Cook was 0-2 in relief.
